Elementary Principal's Report



March 17, 2014

Elementary Activities:

3rd Grade teachers were the guest speakers at the February 10th PTO meeting. They shared information on the NeSA assessments and how they work to prepare students for their first state-wide testing experience. 1st Grade teachers presented at the March 3rd PTO meeting. Their presentation focused on writing.

Our Young Authors Celebration was held on February 26th. Parent and author, Tom Spears, served as our speaker and did a wonderful job of connecting with the K-5th grade audience. Twenty-one students were recognized at the celebration. Three of these students were also selected as building winners: Ellie Stein (K-1st), Dayna Wilson (2nd-3rd) and Nellie Ward (4th-5th).

5th Grade students participated in their DARE graduation on February 28th. One student from each classroom was selected to share their DARE essays during graduation. These students were Nick Starns, Nellie Ward and Jaiden Tweton.

The 2014-2015 Kindergarten Parent Meeting was held on March 4th. We currently have 64 children on our census who meet the age requirements to attend kindergarten next fall. Parents of twenty-six students attended the meeting. Enrollment packets will be mailed to the remaining families on our census list. Kindergarten Round-up is scheduled for April 11th.

Our 4th/5th Vocal and Instrumental Concert is scheduled for March 20. The program theme will be 'jazz'.

Professional Activities:

SLO & Progress Monitoring Mid-Year Meetings have been completed with all elementary staff. Meeting topics included reviewing and discussing evidence pertaining to:

- student progress in reading and writing
- strategies and interventions used to differentiate instruction
- additional interventions/next steps to assist students

A Literacy PLC was held on February 12th. Topics included differentiating instruction for writing and good fit books for reading:

- Use of whole group instruction, small group instruction and 1:1 lessons (Trisha Nicholson - video)
- Varied writing plans – color coded webs (Kayla Laune)
- Mary Hall shared a video that demonstrated how she teaches students to select 'good fit' books. Her method also generates excitement and interest in specific books and authors.

Pat Yardley and Julie Mink will be attending a Reading Recovery PD session in Fremont on March 20th. This session will include Reading Recovery colleague visits and lesson observations at Washington School. Following the colleague visits, Pat Yardley has been invited to present on AGES's method of providing services to KDG and first grade Title I students and the use of the Google Doc for coordination with the classroom teachers.

During 3rd quarter, 40+ special education meetings were held with parents to review testing results and/or develop Individual Education Plans or Individual Family Service Plans (ages 0-3). The Student Assistance Team also held 6 meetings with teachers and parents to discuss academic and/or behavioral concerns of students and develop intervention plans.

State-Wide Technical Difficulties with NeSA (State On-Line Testing System) cause challenges for AGPS staff and students ... but, the "We Can" attitude continues to permeate efforts of all as we prepare for NeSA 2014!

State refuses to pay after glitches with Nebraska's online writing tests

LINCOLN — Glitches with the online state writing test are causing fallout for the company that administered it.

Because of the 'glitch' referenced in the above headline, it is likely that for the second year in a row state writing test results (NeSA-W) for 8th grade and 11th grade students will 'not count towards state and federal goals'. Districts will still receive their results and parents will also receive the individual student reports in the fall, however; the results will likely not be shared with the public or be included in any of the state ranking areas.

A few AGPS 8th and 11th grade students did experience some of the 'glitches' during the NeSA-W testing that occurred in February. Some students were unable to initially log into the system, a few were repeatedly 'bumped off' the system, and a couple experienced some issues with the formatting tools within the system. Fortunately, none of our students lost any of their writing. And, those that did experience some of these challenges during testing were patient and resilient! Though all of our students were able to complete the NeSA-W, the 'frustration' experienced may have had an impact on their writing performance.

Unfortunately as staff and students prepare for the upcoming state tests in reading, math, and science (NeSA-R, NeSA-M, and NeSA-S), state-wide technical difficulties with the on-line testing system continue to cause challenges.

- C4L (Check for Learning – NeSA on-line Test Prep. and Progress Monitoring Tool) was delayed in opening this fall and down/inaccessible for several weeks recently as software updates and 'fixes' were deployed
- NeSA On-line Tools Practices – Access delayed and/or inaccessible for several weeks
- NeSA On-Line Guided Practice – Access delayed and/or inaccessible for several weeks
- NeSA On-Line Practice Tests – Access delayed and/or inaccessible for several weeks
- District Technology Team (and outside tech. support) have invested many hours in working to troubleshoot with state testing vendor to ensure system is working for our staff and students

Starting the week of March 10th, it *appears* that most AGPS staff and students are able to access and use many of the tools noted above. (District Tech. and Support staff were still working to 'update' all computers and lap-tops as each machine in the district has had to be 'manually' addressed in order to install the most recent software fixes and updates)

Throughout these challenges, AGPS staff have continued to adapt and positively work to ensure their students are prepared to be successful on NeSA-R, NeSA-M, and NeSA-S.

AGPS students are scheduled to begin 2014 state testing in early-April. The Nebraska Department of Education recently announced that because of the technical difficulties, the NeSA testing window has been extended a week. All 3rd-8th, and 11th grade students must take the state tests between March 24th and May 9th. (It takes approx. 5 weeks for AGPS to test all students; we traditionally use the last week of the testing window to conduct make-up test sessions as in addition to student performance goals we are also held accountable for ensuring that 100% of our students are tested.)

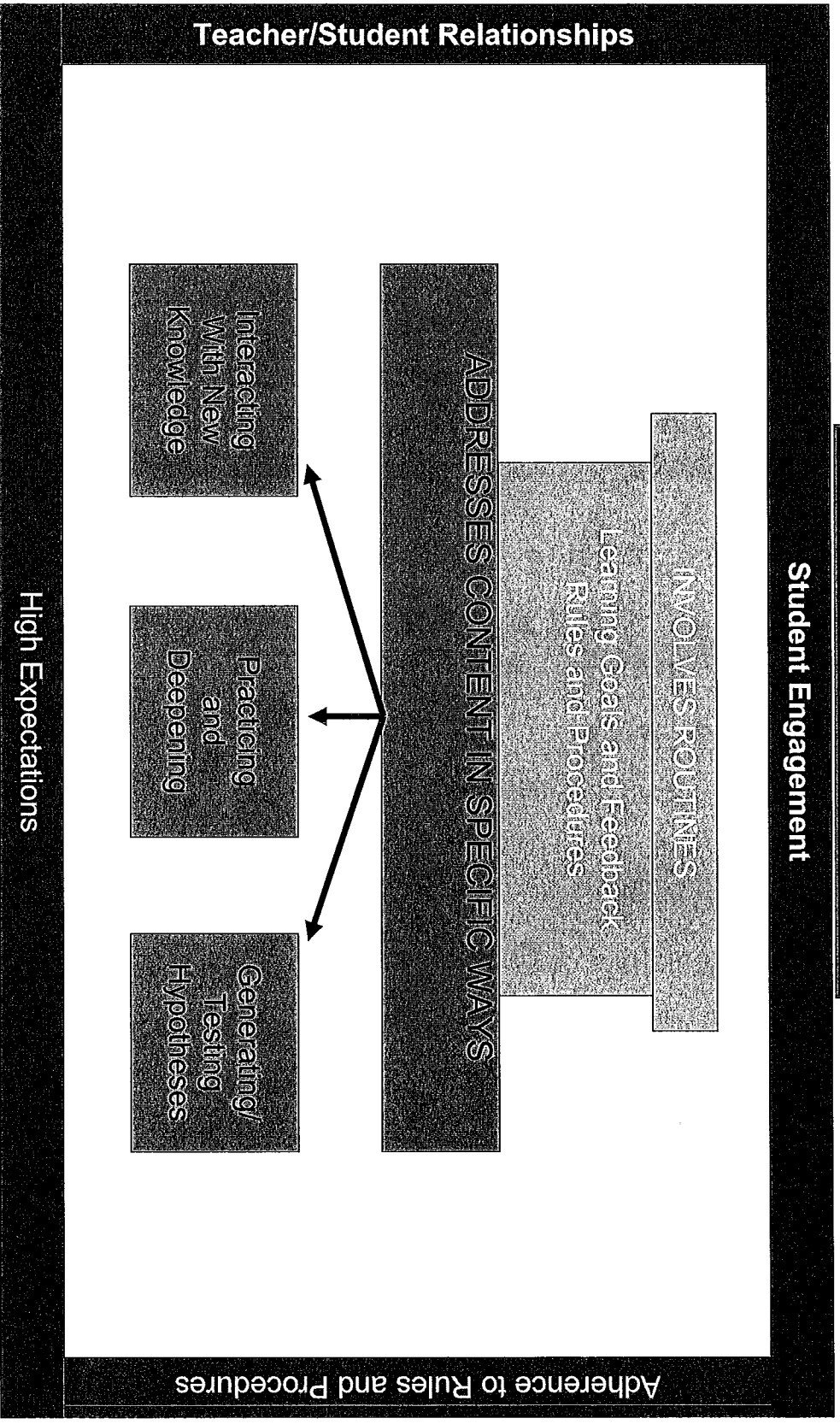

MARZANO Notes...

- “Students end up with major, often unique gaps when we aren’t clear about what students learn, and to what degree they learn it.”
- “Deliberate, intentional practice is the key.”

What do you look for as routine components of every lesson?

- Reviewing and/or Practicing important rules and procedures
- Reviewing learning goals, connecting activities to goals and evaluating students on the goal(s).
- Tracking student progress toward reaching the goal(s).
- Celebrating success when goal(s) are achieved.

SAMPLE of Teacher Evidence

- Teacher has a learning goal posted so that students can see it
- The learning goal is a clear statement of knowledge or information as opposed to an activity or assignment
- Teacher makes reference to the learning goal throughout the lesson
- Teacher has a scale or rubric that relates to the learning goal posted so that all students can see it.
- Teacher makes reference to the scale or rubric throughout the lesson

Possible Student Evidence

- When asked, students can explain the learning goal for the lesson
- When asked, students can explain how their current activities relate to the learning goal
- When asked, students can explain the meaning of the levels of performance articulated in the scale or rubric
