Staff Development/Improvement/Training:

- Continued staff development on assessment, engagement, and grading procedures
- AGHS Graduate and stage combat trained actor Michael Hollinger is coming back to AGHS to assist us with an 'acting' clinic in April. He has several training certifications in 'stage combat' and came to us wanting to 'give back' to AG students!
- Observation update: I have completed 39 walk-throughs or informal observations; 45 individual meetings with teachers regarding SLO & PD plans or improvement plans; 12 Formal Observations (include meetings before the visit, after the visit, and a full class visit (40-47 minutes).

Activities/Calendar Update:

Twenty-one students were honored at the Young Authors Celebration on Wednesday, February 25. Three of these students were also selected as building winners and will have their stories published in the Ashland Gazette. These three students are Cael Smith, Mattea Kassebaum and Annalise Ptacek. Lindsay Rogers was the guest speaker at the Young Authors Celebration. Ms. Rogers is the Wildlife Education Specialist with the Nebraska Game & Parks Commission and is responsible for publication of Trail Tales, a magazine for Nebraska's 4th grade students and writes Nebraska-specific wildlife curriculum. Each young author received a 'Write' poster, composition notebook, wildlife booklets and cards from Lindsay Rogers and a Young Authors certificate. The students also enjoyed a pizza snack and shared their stories in small groups with friends and family.

The elementary school and PTO are partnering with Rack Room Shoes located at Nebraska Crossing on the 'Shoes that Fit' program. The 'Shoes that Fit' program provides shoes to children that have a need and is funded through donations. Families were invited to submit a form indicating a desire to receive shoes for their elementary age children. 
early literacy skills for preschool - 1st grade children.
